CONFERENCE

IFIP/SEC '95, THE 11TH INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE on Information Security, starts the second decade of IFIP/SEC conferences. This conference will therefore briefly review the development of Information Security during the last decade, and will specifically look at the growing importance of Information Security during the next decade.

Six highly acknowledged international leaders on Information Security have been invited to form the backbone of the conference and to establish the chosen conference theme of IFIP/SEC '95:

INFORMATION SECURITY - THE NEXT DECADE

Authors are requested to submit original work, not previously published, on any of the above or other Information Security related topics.

4. INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

Authors must submit three (3) printed copies of an extended abstract, comprehensive enough to allow proper and effective refereeing. The extended abstract should be between 5 and 10 A4 pages. In the final paper authors may expand on the work mentioned in the abstract. The normal procedures for submitting papers for refereeing purposes hold. Written release for publication and copyright will be required for all papers accepted. Each paper must have an abstract and a separate cover page. The cover page must include:

- ☛ The title of the presentation.
- ☛ Full names of all author(s), current position, affiliations, contact address, telephone, fax and e-mail numbers, point of contact if more than one author.
- ☛ Relevant experience in presenting papers at conferences.

No identification information on any of the authors should appear in the abstract itself.

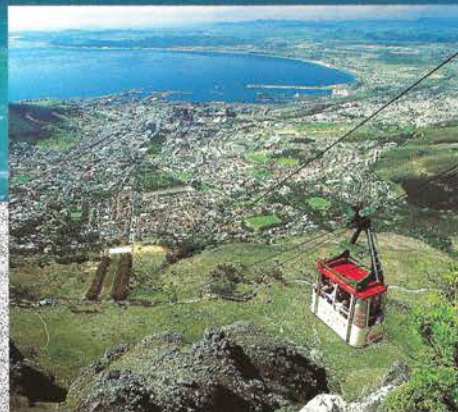

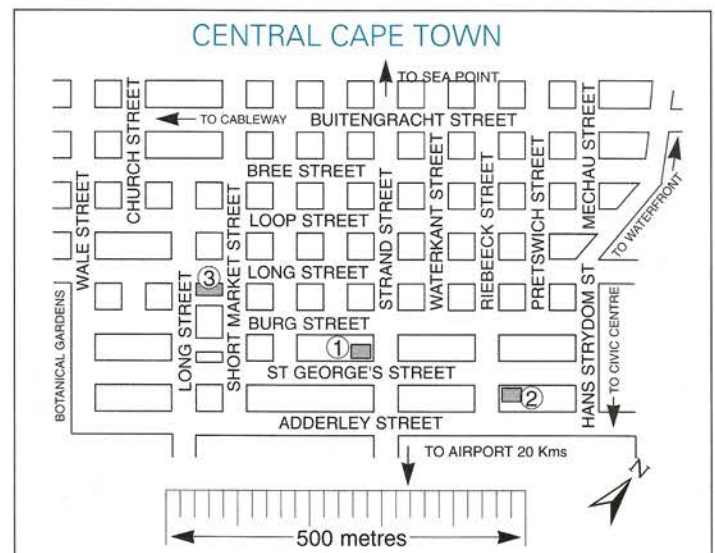
