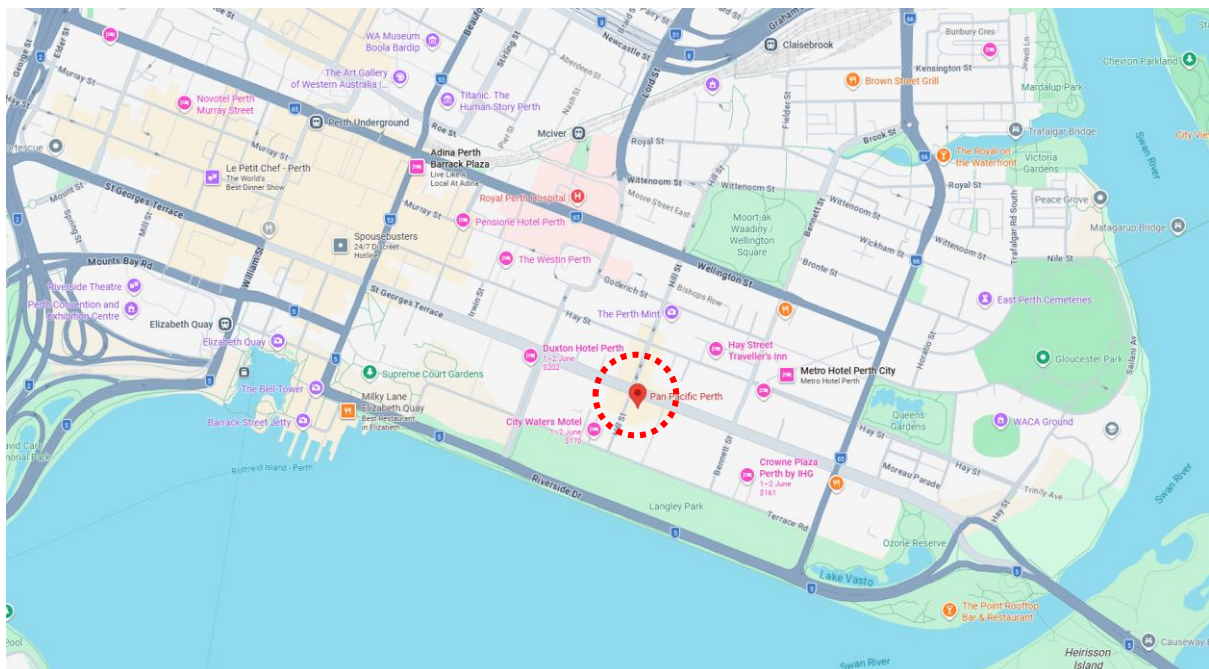
1. Welcome to Perth

On behalf of IFIP TC11 and the hosting institution (Edith Cowan University), we welcome you to Perth for the SEC/WISE conference. The information contained in this document will help with your arrival and local logistics. If you have any queries prior to the event, please reach out to us (info@ifipsec.org). During the event, colleagues at our registration desk will be happy to help.

2. Venue

The conference is being hosted at the Pan Pacific Hotel in Perth, Australia. The hotel is in the Central Business District (CBD) on Adelaide Terrace. Delegates can stay at the Pan Pacific with many other hotels in close proximity (including the Novotel across the road).

Registration opens at 08:30 on Tuesday 9th June (the same for Wednesday and Thursday for those arriving late). On arrival at the hotel, take the lift or the stairs to the convention level (located towards the left of the lobby).

The foyer area will host the registration, breaks and lunches as well as two social events. Sessions are scheduled across three rooms (Grand River Ballroom West, Mt Newman and Pilbara). We also have a smaller room (Murchison) for delegates to use as a breakout room for meetings, calls etc.

4. Social events

Tuesday 9th June

We will host a reception at 16:30-18:30 in the foyer area. Canapes and drinks (alcoholic and soft) will be served. During the reception we will also have a First Nations Cultural Artefacts exhibition providing an opportunity to engage with examples of the tools and materials used by Australian Aboriginal people for thousands of years.

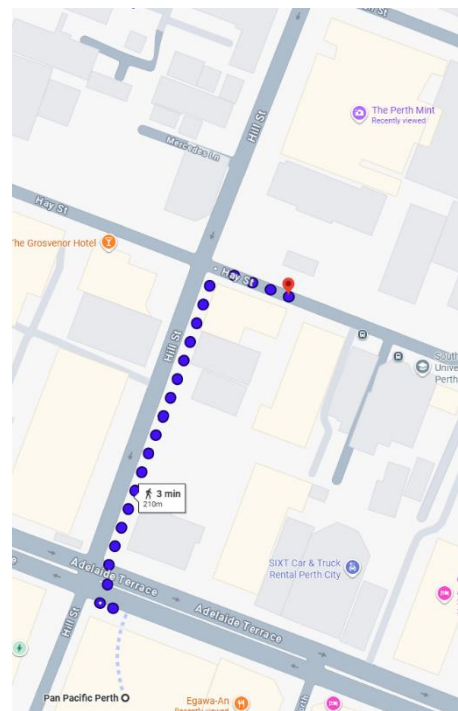
Wednesday 10th June

Following the afternoon break we will walk a short distance (approximately four minutes) to the Perth Mint for a tour (see map to the right). Delegates be guided to the Perth Mint promptly with the first group departing the hotel at approximately 15:25. The tour will conclude at approximately 17:00 to allow delegates to return to hotels before the conference dinner.

The conference dinner is scheduled for 19:00 with a three-course meal accompanied by alcoholic and soft drinks.

Thursday 11th June

We will host a farewell sundowner at 14:30-16:30 in the foyer area (a 'sundowner' is an Australian tradition of drinks at the end of the day – yes, we're doing it a little early, but it is winter!). Drinks (alcoholic and soft) will be served together with the afternoon break.



During the sundowner event, we will host a Corporates Compromised™ Workshop in the Mt Newman room – delegates are encouraged to participate in this workshop.

5. Perth

Perth has been consistently rated as one of the top ten most liveable cities in the world for over 15 years. It has a relaxed lifestyle and is located in the same time-zone as much of Asia. Perth has a Mediterranean climate with hot, dry summers and mild, wet winters. It is the sunniest capital city in Australia with clear blue skies approximately 70% of the year (unfortunately, June sits in the Australian winter).

Perth has much to offer in terms of attractions beyond the event with opportunities to explore the Perth CBD, travel within WA (including to see the Quokka's at Rottnest Island) or across Australia. There is also the opportunity to use Perth as a springboard to explore Asia.

Rottnest Island is a short ferry ride (08:30 departure from Perth with a 16:30 return). Booking is recommended.

Fremantle Prison is a short train journey from the city (can take a train from Elizabeth Quay or Perth Underground Stations). Fremantle is also home to the WA Maritime Museum and the Shipwrecks Museum with Fremantle Markets a popular weekend destination.

Perth has an international airport and has direct flights to many countries, or, via hubs (e.g. Singapore, Doha, Hong Kong, Kuala Lumpur, Dubai). Perth is also well connected for domestic travel with daily flights to all capital cities.

7. Getting to your hotel

Perth Airport (PER) has train access to the city (18 minutes) with other airport transfer options available (taxi/Uber/DiDi).

Australia has 220-240v 50Hz AC power and a three-bladed power plug style (type I). Please ensure you bring your own power adaptor(s).

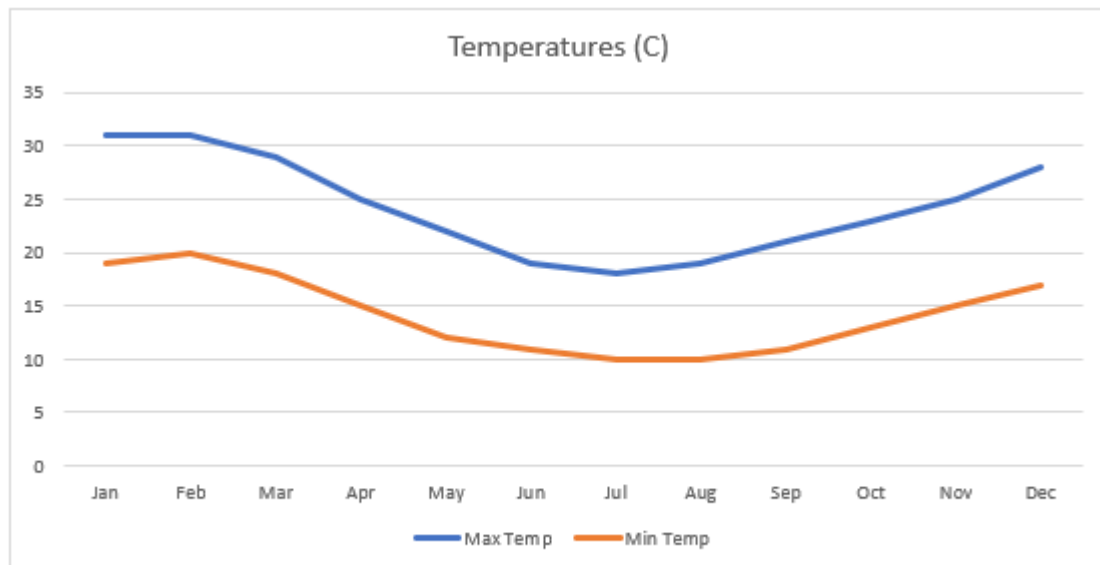


11. Travel in the city

12. Weather

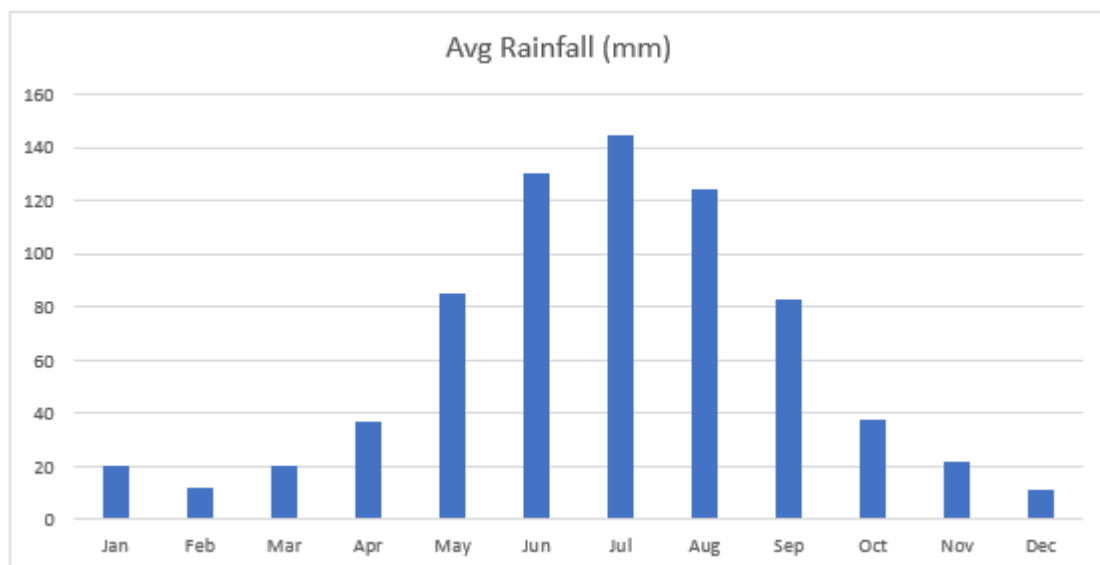
